If Bethany students wish to apply for, and attend Fall 2011 the following is the required timeline of activities:

*Undergraduate deadline for application and housing = August 1, 2011 (\$35 Application Fee due with application)*

*Receipt of transcripts by August 1, 2011*

*FAFSA (other financial aid) etc.: August 1, 2011 (Due to the paperwork involved the earlier students get their financial aid paperwork taken care of the better. If a student does not have his or her financial aid paperwork completed before school begins the student is required to make the first payment without the benefit of financial aid.)*

*Deposit received by August 1, 2011 (\$100 Tuition Deposit; \$200 Housing Deposit)*

Approval of application

International Students:

LPC requires international students to complete the same admissions process as any other student. However, a pre-application must be completed before the full application is sent. The pre-application must include documentation of English proficiency (TOEFL 550 [paper-based], 213 [computer-based] or 79 [internet-based]). International applicants who are in the United States on an R-1 visa are required to submit documentation from the organization which the applicant is serving.

TUITION and FEES

Bethany Students who are accepted at Life Pacific College will have the same tuition as other students at Life Pacific College:

*Academic Year 2011-2012:*

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

*To begin process:*

1. Apply for admission to Life Pacific College.
2. Complete the online FAFSA form by going to [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov) Life Pacific College's Federal School Code is 016029.
3. Complete any supplemental documentation as requested by the Financial Aid Office in a timely manner.

### *Types of Aid Programs*

Endowed Scholarships – Scholarships based on need, achievement, and student interests are available through the College. Online application process for each year begins February 12. These scholarships represent small (\$100 - \$1000) grants to students.

Federal Pell Grant – applicant must be a US citizen or permanent resident, demonstrate financial need, and must not have previously received a bachelor's degree. Students may apply for the Pell Grant by filling out the FAFSA.

Federal SEOG – Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant is available to certain Pell Grant recipients.

State of California Grants – The Cal Grant program provides awards for California resident applicants who demonstrate financial need and meet GPA requirements. California resident students may apply by filling out the FAFSA and a GPA verification form. To be eligible for an award, the student must submit both the FAFSA and the GPA verification form by March 2.

Loans – LPC participates in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program. Students and parents may be able to borrow up the cost of education through federal loans. To be eligible for federal loan, students must fill out the FAFSA.

Private loans are also available to students to assist with the cost of education. For more detailed information contact the Financial Aid Office.

LIFE Grant / Ministry Leadership Grant – Students in the traditional (on-campus) program who are dependents of active licensed ministers or who are active licensed ministers themselves may be eligible for a discount. In the traditional program the discount (called the *LIFE Grant*) is three free units per semester (\$1200).

Students in the Degree Completion Program who are active licensed ministers may apply for the *Ministry Leadership Grant*. This grant provides a 25% discount in tuition.

Applications for the *LIFE Grant* and the *Ministry Leadership Grant* may be found on the LPC website. Students must maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA and be enrolled full-time.

Ministerial Grants at Bethany (for comparison purposes).

Missionary Discount

50% tuition awarded to AG missionaries and qualified dependents of AG missionaries. Verification of missionary status required.

Ministerial Scholarship

10% of tuition and is awarded to licensed /ordained ministers whose primary vocation is in the ministry. Copy of ordination or license required and letter from church certifying vocation.

Athletic Scholarships – Life Pacific College does not offer athletic scholarships.

LPC does not offer any additional scholarships

Some courses in the traditional undergraduate majors are offered online or through independent study.

Life Pacific College desires to provide a transfer friendly environment for Bethany students. Therefore, we will work with each student to provide a scenario where the degree can be completed in a comparable time frame. This includes acceptance of relevant units transferred in to Bethany from accredited and non-accredited institutions. We do require that a minimum of 32 units (24 within the major) be completed at Life Pacific College (exceptions may be made for those within 18 units of graduating). Only coursework with a grade of C- or better is transferable. Grade points do transfer.

A course comparison between Bethany and LPC courses for LPC's Transformational Ministry and Biblical Studies degrees can be found at end of this document.

## **ANCILLARY SERVICES AND OPPORTUNITIES**

**Athletic Opportunities:** LPC offers the opportunity for participation in various intramural sports. There is gymnasium and fitness center on campus. LPC does not offer inter-collegiate sports.

**Ministry Opportunities:** LPC places a strong emphasis upon the student's active participation in local church ministry and considers this a necessary part of the educational program offered. To that end, ministry formation requirements tied to local church involvement and service are embedded in required coursework as well as tracked in the Office of Ministry Formation. Life Pacific College also seeks to provide a broad exposure to para-church organizations and community outreaches. Each student in the traditional program must complete one outreach per month. Various opportunities to minister through music, evangelism, drama, social services, and cross-cultural teams are made available through campus-based initiatives. An internship is required of all students. Students can contact the Office of Ministry Formation for more information ((877) 886-5433 x361; ministryformation@lifepacific.edu).

Additionally, LPC offers a study abroad program where students can spend a semester in Israel while staying on-track for their degree. Students can contact the Office of Global Education for more information.

LPC offers courses in music and applied music. There are opportunities to serve on the Chapel Worship Teams.

**Resident Life:** The campus has furnished residence halls, which provide comfortable accommodations. Full meal service is available in the Café.


All single students in the traditional program under the age of 21 must live on-campus. Appeals to live off campus, including those from single students living with parents or guardians, must be filed with the Office of Residence Life prior to registration. Exemptions are not automatic.

Current residence hall cost is \$3000 per semester. This cost includes full Café meal privileges.
